- Danielle's Peacebuilders opinion column has appeared in Newsweek since January 2024.
- As an American diplomat, Danielle promoted democracy and peace around the world with the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). In this role, she supported peace processes in Uganda and South Sudan, democratic transitions and women's political participation in the Republic of Georgia and Sri Lanka, and civic engagement in all these places.
- For three years, she served as a violence prevention expert on Washington D.C.'s Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board, an independent, quasi-judicial body that reviewed appeals when the Metropolitan Police Department denied or revoked a concealed carry license.

- Danielle serves on the Board of Directors for Grannies Respond, a non-profit organization that provides compassionate and respectful support for asylum seekers seeking safety in the United States, and Everyday Peace Indicators, a non-profit organization conducting participatory research with communities affected by violent conflict around the world.
- In 2004, she received a graduate degree in International Relations and Peace as a member of the first ever cadre of Rotary Peace Fellows.
- Danielle was a U.S. Peace Corps volunteer in Burkina Faso (West Africa) from 1998-2000.
